It was originally developed for use by our military. But now some law enforcement agencies are using it. The "it" is a hand-held radar that can "see" through the walls of buildings to reveal if there are people inside, and if so, where they're located.

While the article described how this device enhances the safety of law enforcement, it also sounded the warning that this could be an invasion of our constitutionally protected privacy. Nine days after breaking this news, USA Today then ran an op-ed with this subtitle: "When officers want to 'see' inside your house, they should get a warrant." The editors approvingly quote members of congress who warn: "Technology that can essentially look inside people's homes presents privacy concerns of the highest order."

While this new device brings fresh concerns about the invasion of our privacy, let's remember that vastly superior technology for peering into our lives has been in use for a long time. The GASE technology penetrates through any thickness of any wall to reveal a high-definition view of what's happening in the most secret of places. GASE stands for God's All-Seeing Eye. in bodily form" (Colossians 2:9) we know that Christ's blood is God's blood that pays our debt of sin, and therefore his penetrating vision is a blessed feature of his protective care. Jesus truly is the Good Shepherd who never allows us get out of his protective sight.

How can we thank Jesus for monitoring our well-being so perfectly? To borrow the words of Dr. Martin Luther, "All this (protective peering) he does that I should be own, and live under him in his kingdom, and serve him in everlasting righteousness, innocence and blessedness."
